





Award Amount	Top-Up**
\$0.00 to \$2,000	There will be no top-up but the student gets to keep the award(s), up to a combined maximum of \$2,000. The amount of the award will not be deducted from the base funding.

- Our Vision: To serve as a liaison between students and faculty, a directory for resources, and foster an inclusive environment where students find the help they need through informal channels










Program Timeline






